Our first article we will discuss; Things to consider when deciding on the perfect college for you.

♦ What subject should I major in?

TIME TO TAKE ACTION

All of us must find a way to make a deposit into the youth of today. There is an urgency for dedicated men and women willing to take a stand for our children. You do not have be a lawyer, a doctor, or even have a degree to give back. Our community needs volunteers, people who will give there time not just their money. These people only need to be aware of situations that impact our streets. They only need to be concerned about the future of our civilization.

Do not take our word for it. Read some of the stats listed below for the graduating class of 2006 as reported by The Michigan Department of Education:

- Only 58% of students in the Lansing Public School District meet or exceeded the standards on the MEAP Test for Reading. This is down from 72% in 2005 and down from 74% in 2004.
- Only 39% of students meet or exceeded the standards in Science and only 35% in Writing, down from 50% in 2005
- Math is also down to 35% and has dropped every year since 2003.
- It is not just the Lansing School District that's in trouble, the state of MI average is almost just as bad. Reading-70%, Science-57%, Writing-55% and Math-52%

If the test scores aren't enough to motivate you what about the economic level for this District. 63% of students in the Lansing School District qualify for reduced or free lunches.

We do not believe that our students are not smart enough to exceed, just that they need to be motivated to exceed. We must provide our students with motivation to want more than what is laid out in front of them. Motivation may be in the form of sports, theater, or just a positive role model that can articulate the opportunities that are available to each and every student. TAKE ACTION NOW AND GIVE
